


THE JOHN PEYTON & MARY KIRRANE STORY



John was a Landholder and Farmer

MARY KIRRANE was born about 1805 in County Mayo in Ireland

1845 - John Peyton married Mary Kirrane on the 7^{th} of June 1845 in Killasser RC Church. Near Swineford, Co Mayo in Ireland by Fr. John McNulty Witnesses: Thomas Peyton and Honoria Howley

THE MICHAEL PEYTON L MARY MCDONNELL STORY



County Mayo Contae Mhaigh Eo Coat of Arms



ICHAEL PEYTON was born in 1848 in Culduff in County Mayo, Ireland to John Peyton and Mary Kirrane

Michael became generally known as "Micky" and was a Road Contractor in Callow in the 1930s





ARY MCDONNELL was baptized on the 20th of July 1850 in Kilmactigue near Belclare in County Sligo, Ireland to Patrick McDonnell and Mary Gallagher

The records indicate Mary McDonnell who was baptised in 1850 was the third daughter of Patrick

McDonnell and Mary Gallagher. It would appear that Mary's two older sisters were also baptised with the name Mary.



The first girl was born in 1846 and must have died prior to 1849, which is when their second daughter was born and given the same name. We can only assume that their second daughter also died in infancy and before the birth of their third child who was baptised in July 1850 as she too was given the name Mary.

Patrick McDonnell and Mary Gallagher went on to have three sons and another daughter

A few memories on Michael (Micky) Peyton (1847 - 1938)

"The first memory I have of my grandfather was catching his hand and going out to a turf reek to get bottle of "poteen". That was where he kept his store of booze. My mother explained to me years later, when I mentioned the incident, that he counted so many sods up and so many sods from the side, then took out a sod put in his hand and took out a bottle and put the sod back again. He was a very tall man. I remember holding my hand up high to reach his hand. I was about four at the time. I also remember going to the well with my grandmother.

Micky Peyton was a champion ploughman and very proud of it. Paddy McNulty (his grandson - Bridget Peyton was his mother) told me he had to keep his hand on his back while he sat on the seat of the plough and drove two horses to plough the furrow.

Both Patrick and Micky did the "Reek" every year -they climbed Croagh Patrick. They went off in the horse and trap - on the Westport side - they climbed one night and had mass on top of the mountain in the morning. The coming down was by far the hardest part, it was cold, slippy, wet and, of course, steep. That was their annual holiday!

My mother remembers Michael setting bones. He put a door on the floor and the patient laid on it. Of course, the patient got whiskey or poteen first.

Micky was involved in the Fenian movement. On one occasion, he was chased on horseback by the English soldiers. He rode to a bridge called "Clangulaune Bridge" - some miles west of Callow. From there he went onto a safe house. There he hid until the soldiers had gone.

I remember my grandfather dying during the Christmas of 1938. The priest at Callow Church missed him at mass on the Sunday prior to his death. So he called to see him at the house in Carne Callow - Delia's house (his granddaughter) where my grandparents were being cared for. The priest said "Michael I did not see you at mass on Sunday." My grandfather replied, "I felt too cold, Father." So the priest said, "Would you like if I anointed you?" - He agreed. They were sitting at the fire and he anointed him. They talked awhile. Two hours later he died."





They are all staying with her Aunt Annie Elizabeth McIntyre aged 55 and Single and has a Fruiterer business

Also there is her Uncle Edwin aged 53 and Single working as a Stuff and Woollen Warehouse Man They were all born in Bradford, Yorkshire apart from William Caffrey and are all residing at 306 Manchester Road Bradford

Writing Songs at 87 – and still going strong

When octogenarian Mrs Florence Peyton entertains her friends on the ivories, she plays her own work — and if she pounded the keyboard everyday for three months would not run out of material.

With more than 100 songs under her belt she can rightly be called a prolific songwriter – and she is still going strong. At 87, her lively mind and nibble fingers could be envied by many 20 years her junior.

But although music has been her first love, she was a pensioner before she started composing.

She penned her first piece in 1956 and claims her current portfolio includes everything from classical to comical – and even an 18- song musical.

She also turned poet although some of her poetry later became lyrics for her music - and she has also written a play.

Mrs Peyton started playing the piano at 10 and took lessons with a classical master.

"I always played for my own entertainment but I was past 60 when I found I had a talent for writing", she explained.

As a student she had to commit all the great works to memory - and she still has fantastic recall. Although she admitted with regret that most of the classics have long since been forgotten, they have been replaced by her own songs.


Some she has submitted to publishers and although none have been accepted she lives in hope and never gives up trying.

"I have faith in my own work because I know it is good", she said

Since moving into the Fairhaven home for the elderly on the promenade in November, Mrs Peyton enjoys visiting her grandson, Mr Michael Peyton and his wife of Broadway, Fleetwood, where she can play on the grand piano from her old home. She also plays everyday on the upright at the Fairhaven – but nothing compares with a good grand

Love

Her poems vary from an ode to a parish priest's dog in her former home town of Bradford to a stark reminder of the late President Kennedy's assassination. They also include more than a sprinkling of love poems.
